See what happens if your child misses just.....

I day per fortnight

that equals 20 days per year

... and therefore, from Kindy to Year 12, that is nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ years of school.

This means the best they can achieve is equal to finishing Year II

I day a week

That equals 40 days per year

Which is 8 weeks per year

... and therefore, from Kindy to Year 12, that is nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ years of school.

This means the best they can achieve is equal to finishing Year 10

2 days a week

That equals 80 days per year

Which is 16 weeks per year

....and therefore, from Kindy to Year 12, that is nearly 5 years of learning missed

This means the best they can achieve is equal to finishing Year 7

3 days a week

That equals 120 days per year

Which is 24 weeks per year

....and therefore, from Kindy to Year 12, that is nearly 8 years of learning missed

This means the best they can achieve is equal to finishing year 6
